Provides a completely separated right-of-way for the exclusive use of bicycles and pedestrians with cross-flow traffic minimized. Fencing encourages use of designated access points. | Proposed Class III Bike Route
Provides for shared use with pedestrian or motor vehicle traffic. Bike routes are marked with signs. | Parks | Golf Course | Transfer Station |
| Existing Class II Bike Lane | Existing Multi-Use Trail | Open Space | City Boundary | Library |
| Proposed Class II Bike Lane
Provides a striped lane for one-way bike travel on a street or highway. Bike lanes are marked with signs and pavement striping. | Proposed Multi-Use Trail
Located primarily in rural areas, these trails are unpaved and are available for equestrian, hiking, and mountain bike use. Trails are marked with lodgepole fencing. | Santa Clara River Open Space | Railroad | Roads |
