

East Walker Trails

Welcome to East Walker Ranch Open Space! This land supports several biotic communities including Chamise-Chaparral, Coastal Sage Scrub, Southern Oak Woodland and Riparian Woodland. Frank Evans Walker settled in Placerita Canyon in 1905, marking the beginning of cattle ranching 🔓 in the area. Remnants, such as old troughs, still dot the surrounding landscape, which has been called one of the most beautiful pieces of untouched land in Los Angeles County.



Starting in the late 1950's this land was used as a manufacturing site providing equipment for the growing automotive and aerospace industries in our country. In your journey along the wide roads, remnant building pads remain visible to tell the story of

of mid-century production and site layout. Monitoring wells associated with the site's restoration are located in some of these areas and should be left undisturbed.
